



Dr. Rudolf Von Urban was to have been a priest. After a chance meeting with Sigmund Freud, and largely due to his influence, he studied medicine in Vienna and graduated in 1904, specializing in psychiatry and psychology. Barely twenty years of age, he became assistant to Karl Von Noorden, internationally known head of the University Clinic of Internal Medicine, and only three years later he was director of the Vienna Cottage Sanatorium. .

In 1922 he gave up the medical field in favor of individual psychology, psychoanalysis; and sex-criminology. His travels took him twice around the world and for some years he lived in the Orient. He studied the love life of primitive peoples and lectured on marital problems at universities throughout Europe.

Called to America professionally in 1936, he decided to make that country his home. After four years at the University of California working on neuroses and psycho-somatic symptoms, he became consulting psychologist to the Superior Court of Monterey County.

Highly regarded in his profession, He has received the commendation of many fellow scientists, including Professor Freud himself.
